Warsaw Recap

- ‘Contribution’ – Domestically driven
- Vague timelines for contributions
- Putting L&D review to COP 21
- Finance COP – Delivering Pittance – AF, LDCF,REDD : Finance(\$100 Billion) still lacks details
- WS 2 & Pre 2020 Ambition – dragged
- No Reference to Equity

Political Overview

- Limericks of Ambition from Japan and Australia
- Wolf in Lamb's Clothing - LMDC – Cornering key issues like Finance, L&D, WS 2 against WS 1 – Tradeoffs
- The original Wolf – US
- EU – Tight Rope – Individual countries better than Commission
- No Driving Force

Mitigation

- **(WS – 1)** Parties agreed to initiate or intensify domestic preparations to determine their contributions so as to be “communicated well in advance” to 2015.
 - Initiate discussions to help Parties prepare for nationally-determined contributions
- Workshop on Domestic Preparation & Briefing with Operating Entities Financial Mechanism and other organizations.
- **WS 2** – Identify activities with High Mitigation potential with focus on scalable and replicable
- Platform for sharing best practice and experience of cities and subnational entities

ADAPTATION and L&D

- The Adaptation Committee encouraged to continue its work –
 - By providing guidance to parties for National Adaptation Plans
 - Seek further coherence with other bodies
- Nairobi WP to continue
- Warsaw International Mechanism for L&D
 - Placed under the Cancun Adaptation Framework
 - Structure, mandate and effectiveness reviewed in COP 21 (2016)

Finance

- GCF (Weak Language)
 - Ambitious and timely contributions to GCF with operationalization by December 2014
 - Initial resource mobilization should reach significant scale
- LTF (Weak Language)
 - Maintain continuity in mobilization toward \$ 100 Billion
 - Biennial Reporting on strategies to scale up from 2014-2020
 - High level dialogues
- Replenishment of AF and LCDF (\$100 Million +)

REDD & Technology

- Warsaw Framework for REDD - plus:
 - Decisions on finance and institutional arrangements for the mechanism
 - The framework is backed by pledges of \$280 million USD from the US, Norway and the UK
- Parties adopted the modalities and procedures of the now operational CTCN and the rules of procedure of its Advisory Board

Bonn ADP 2-4

- Formal Contact Group Established
- WS 2 – Workshops around RE & EE
- Some Traction around equity
- Still disagreement on elements of 2015 Agreement – Different visions
- Lot of conversations around ‘Nationally Determined Contributions’

WS 2

- Bonn Ministerial
- The Technical Expert Meetings at ADP 2.4 focus on renewable energy and energy efficiency. In this context, ADP Co-Chairs invite Parties and observer organizations to showcase initiatives and projects on these topics on our website.
- Submission to UNFCCC on RE+EE (Other high mitigation potentials) – Last date 30th March
- BIG Q – How does UNFCCC help initiatives around RE & EE ? Ideas around this ?

Climate Summit

- Called for by the UNSG
 - Catalyze ambitious action on the ground to reduce emissions and strengthen climate resilience
 - Mobilize Political Will for an ambitious global legal agreement by 2015

Climate Summit - Format

- **UNSG pre meeting with select group of HOS**
- **HOS meeting – Making announcements**
- **Parallel discussion on thematic Areas (Delivery Room)** - Business, NGOs, MDBs and other stakeholders from a (Approx. 30 Sectoral issues) respective Sectoral/thematic area will come together to discuss the issue and discuss a way forward to build on success. Some of the suggested thematic areas are energy; short-lived climate pollutants; cities and transportation; land-use (e.g. related to sustainable agriculture and forestry); adaptation and disaster risk reduction; and climate finance and the economic drivers. These thematic areas are currently being discussed and the ones with the highest political buy in from countries will be taken forward for discussion in NYC.
- **# Narrative Room** – Possibly the NGO space where there will be discussions around how one should shift the narrative around Climate change. There are 4 major themes under which these discussions will be taking place (1) Economic Case for Action (2) Sustainable Livelihoods and Lifestyles (3) Science and Innovation (4) Co-benefits of climate action

Climate Summit – CAN’s Overarching Objectives

- The messages from the summit *should reflect scientific urgency of climate change and the need to break away from the current fossil fuel based dependency* transitioning towards a just renewable energy and climate resilient future for all.
- Post the summit there should be a sense that *climate change is back on the political agenda* and needs to be addressed urgently
 - Renewed high level political re-engagement towards an ambitious , fair and effective global agreement on climate change.
 - Key stakeholders (Political Establishment and Business) explicitly understand the risks associated with failure, the economic benefit of urgent action on climate change, and climate stability being an essential element towards poverty eradication.
- *# Global Civil Society and other diverse stakeholders standing united and posing a credible threat to governments*
